Principles to follow for Partnership funding applications

- **High Value – High Impact:** Bids must demonstrate their work will provide good value for money and have impact which is scalable and London focused.
- **Alignment with Strategic Priorities:** The programmes must support the partnership priorities as set out in the London Vision, Recovery Missions and/ or Health Inequalities Strategy ambitions and must reduce inequalities. In addition, programmes must address current challenges in the health and care landscape and be able to demonstrate that they are responding to the needs of Londoners. Priority will be given to projects/ programmes which have not previously received funding from this partnership grant.
- **Clear Evidence Base:** The programmes must have a clear evidence base (this doesn't need to be formal, e.g. published studies or RCT) for the outcomes they are looking to achieve, or be working to build that evidence base.
- **Financially sustainable after this financial year:** The programmes must be able to receive the funding in this financial year, and deliver sustainable benefits that do not require ongoing partnership funding in future years. The programmes of work should be deliverable within no longer than a 12 month period.
- Bids must be for awards **between £50-£150,000**. To be granted to one, single organisation.
- **Add value** –funding can't be used to shore up main stream funding which has been disinvested or is under pressure.
- **Place based work and reduce inequalities** –bids are encouraged which take a place based approach and must tackle inequalities.
- **Governance and quality assurance** must be in place.
- Bidders must be willing to **provide progress updates** and ensure that outcomes and impact can be evaluated.

Process Instructions

- Bids are invited for the 2022/23 partnership funding.
- Applicants must read all information in this pack in detail before submitting an Expression of Interest (EOI).
- Deadline for EOIs is **9am on Monday 7 November 2022** -please note that anything received later than this date will not be considered.
- Applicants should complete the **excel template attached to this email to submit their EOI**.
- EOIs should be submitted to Hello@HealthyLondon.org – please mark the subject heading as follows: **EOI (date) (your organisation name)**.
- If you have any questions which are not addressed either by this information pack or the excel template column heading notes please contact Anisa.Goodwin@nhs.net
- EOIs will be assessed by a panel made up of policy colleagues from across the London Partnership.
- Applicants who are put forward to a second stage will be required to complete a full application by **28 November 2022**. A full bid template will be sent.
- Applicants/programmes must be able to guarantee strong governance and financial assurance.
- Successful projects / applicants will be required to report on progress regularly at agreed intervals. A template for the update will be sent directly.
